STARTING YOUR DOCTORATE

You wish to start a doctorate at the University of Hamburg Business School?

- A warm welcome to our Graduate School of Business Administration!
 - → Find two supervisors and apply for admission!

How does the process work?



You start your studies according to the prevailing <u>doctoral degree</u> <u>regulations dated 10 Apr 2024</u>:

- During your studies you earn a minimum of 12 credit points (CP) (e.g. via doctoral courses, teaching, presentations at conferences etc.).
 - → At least 6 of these credits must be obtained through doctoral courses.
- You write a dissertation (cumulative or monograph).
- Graduates are awarded the title "Doctor rerum oeconomicarum" ("Dr. rer. oec.").



Recommendation: Follow the additional <u>academic regulations for the structured doctoral degree program Research in Business Administration from 10 July 2024 [PDF]</u> ("Promotionsstudienordnung") i. e. "Research in Business Administration-Program":

- This program requires a minimum of 32 credit points (e.g., via doctoral courses, presentations at conferences, etc.).
- You write a dissertation (cumulative or monograph).
- Graduates are awarded the title "Doctor rerum oeconomicarum" (Dr. rer. oec.) and additionally the "Certificate of Research in Business Administration".



Advantages of completing the "Research in Business Administration-Program":

- Only those enrolled in the "Research in Business Administration-Program" are eligible to apply for funding of doctoral courses.
- If at the end of your doctoral studies you have <u>not</u> met the requirements for this program but have met the requirements of the doctoral degree regulations, you will still be eligible for the doctor title ("Dr. rer. oec.").
 - → It's worth to try!
- You earn the Graduate School of Business Administration "Certificate of Research in Business Administration".



APPLICATION FOR DOCTORAL STUDIES:

- First step: Find two supervisors for your studies. The <u>list of disciplinary groups</u> might help you. You do this on your own, the admin office will <u>not</u> assist in this process.
- Second step: Your designated supervisors and you sign the consent to supervision.
- Third step: Latest within three months after having started your doctoral studies you start your application in <u>DOCATA</u>. There you upload:
 - i. the signed consent to supervision,
 - ii. your current CV with (scanned) signature and date, and
 - iii. a copy of your master's degree certificate.



CONTINUES APPLICATION FOR DOCTORAL STUDIES:

- You can start studies any time throughout the year; the semester fee is due at the end of March and the end of September.

Then the Doctoral Committee decides upon your application:

- a) Either you are admitted to our Business School as doctoral student, or
- b) you are admitted to our Business School as doctoral student UNDER PRE-CONDITIONS, or
- c) your application for admission is rejected.
- After having received the written admission to doctoral studies (cases a) and b)) at our Business School you enroll at Campus Center (https://www.uni-hamburg.de/en/campuscenter/bewerbung/promotion.html).
- Please provide your student ID number to the admin office (if you receive a new one) (bwl.promotion@uni-hamburg.de).



DURING YOUR DOCTORAL STUDIES:

- You comply with the <u>Statutes for Ensuring Good Scientific Practice and Avoiding Scientific Misconduct [PDF]</u>;
- Together with your supervisors:
 - you discuss the exposé you wrote about one year after starting your doctoral studies,
 - you regularly meet for progress discussions on your research field (written records),
 - you develop a concept for your data management. You hand in a signed (by you and your first supervisor) declaration when submitting your dissertation in DOCATA.
- You earn credit points (CP) for participating in research courses, conferences etc.



CREDIT POINTS (CP) DURING YOUR DOCTORAL STUDIES AT UNIVERSITY OF HAMBURG BUSINESS SCHOOL:

1. If you follow the doctoral degree regulations of 10 April 2024:

The annex on page 15 is relevant and you have to fill out the form for verification of credit points (CP) for doctoral degree regulations 2024 (available for download)

- → You need 12 LP
- 2. If you follow the "Research in Business Administration-Program":

You have to fill out the Transcript of Records (ToR) (available for download)

→ You need 32 IP



How to Earn Credit Points (CP)?

You earn CP with:

- Doctoral courses
- Own presentations (in internal or external doctoral workshops, conferences)
 - → At least one presentation is obligatory for "Research in Business Administration-Program"
- Courses in didactics
- Teaching
 - → Not eligible for credit in "Research in Business Administration-Program"



How to Earn Credit Points (CP)? (con't):

- Information on the validity of doctoral courses: <u>Recognizing credits</u> according to doctoral degree regulations of 2024.
- Please register to the internal courses via STiNE.
- To earn CP, please check that the criteria:
 - duration (hours/days)
 - agenda/module description
 - completed study assignment (own presentation, term or seminar paper, written exam...)

are fulfilled.

Important: Certificates that only confirm "successful participation" without any further specification of the evaluation criteria <u>cannot</u> be accepted.



How to Earn Credit Points (CP)? (con't):

- If you follow the <u>doctoral degree regulations</u> (min. 12 CP):
 - Consider the Form for verification of credit points (CP) for doctoral degree regulations 2024
 - → Min. 6 CP: doctoral courses (methods and/or specialization)
 - → Teaching can be credited (page 2 of <u>information on</u> recognizing credit for teaching acc. to doctoral degree reg. 2024)
 - → Presentations can be credited



How to Earn Credit Points (CP)? (con't):

- If you follow the <u>"Research in Business Administration"-Program</u> (min. 32 CP):
 - The courses are divided into three categories. You can find the courses on our main research website:
 - methodology courses: min. 10 credits,
 - ii. specialization courses: min. 10 credits, and
 - iii. supplementary courses/workshops/presentations: min. 12 credits
 - → Please note that in this program, teaching cannot be credited.



i) Doctoral courses in the category "methods"

- Module "Matheuristics" (5 CP); May/June: Prof. Dr. Stefan Voß
- Module "Advanced Modelling & Optimization" (5 CP); June: Prof. Dr. Malte Fliedner & Prof. Dr. Knut Haase



ii) Doctoral courses in the category "specialization"

- Courses in this category include:
 - Seminars/workshops on methods, software, theories (generalized or in specific research area).
- These courses are credited according to valid proofs (see before: duration in hours/days, agenda/module description, completed study assignment).
 - → No CP without these criteria.
- See <u>Doctoral studies</u>: <u>University of Hamburg Business School</u>: <u>Universität</u>
 <u>Hamburg (uni-hamburg.de)</u> > B.



iii) Doctoral courses in the category "supplements"

- Courses in this category include:
 - Seminars/workshops eligible to the doctoral degree qualifying program, e. g. of the University of Hamburg ("academic writing", "project management"), (2 CP per one full day)
 - Presentation of your own research project at a doctoral program colloquium, a doctoral program workshop, a conference (4 CP for each presentation/conference)
 - → One presentation is obligatory

Please provide a certificate of your participation/presentation, and in cases of seminars/workshops the proof of a completed study assignment!



iii) Doctoral courses in the category "supplements" – external courses

- <u>External</u> courses and participation in other doctoral programs can be credited in this category.
 - However, these external courses cannot be credited if they cover similar/identical topics like the doctoral courses of the Graduate School of Business Administration.
 - You are of course free to take part, but in case of similar/identical methodology or content, the course will not be credited.
 - External courses should preferably cover topics which the Graduate School of Business Administration does not offer.



Submitting documentation

- When finalizing your doctoral studies and before handing in your thesis, please present the following documentation at the Graduate School of Business Administration's admin office (bwl.promotion@uni-hamburg.de) in order to have your credit points acknowledged (see "downloads" on https://www.bwl.uni-hamburg.de/en/forschung/promotion.html):
 - For the doctorate according to doctoral degree regulations (min. 12 credits): <u>Verification of credit points (CP) for doctoral degree regulations</u>
 2024
 - for the "Research in Business Administration-Program": additionally the <u>Transcript of Records (ToR)</u> proving that the requirements were met (min. 32 CP)
 - Please provide the certificates/proofs of participation in pdf format as one single document and in chronological order (old to new). Thank you!



We will then check your documentation and issue an overview/confirmation on your credit points.

- If you successfully finished the "Research in Business Administration-Program", you will additionally obtain the certificate "Research in Business Administration".
- Please remember to register your three longest stays abroad in DOCATA.



Submitting your thesis

- Once your CP are approved, you can hand in your dissertation:
 - Please start the "application for doctorate proceedings/Antrag Prüfungsverfahren" in DOCATA, thereby also uploading the pdf-version of your thesis in DOCATA.
 - Please submit one printed copy of your thesis, signed as the original, to the admin office (MO18, post box or room 3007).
 - The printed version must be a 100% match with the pdf file uploaded in DOCATA; this applies also for all further versions!
 - Please also upload in DOCATA the signed <u>Transcript of Records (ToR)</u> and
 - the declaration for your data management (you and your first supervisor sign).
- The Doctoral Committee will decide upon the examination committee you proposed.
